

# **About The Bay**

The Bay is a signature public park along Sarasota Bay designed to be "one park for all" – open and accessible, free and welcoming for everyone to enjoy. This beloved gathering place is transforming 53 acres of precious city-owned land into a blue and green oasis – transforming what was once a parking lot into a dynamic public park.

### **Touchstones of The Bay**

Since the beginning, the Guiding Principles and the Master Plan serve as "Touchstones" that inform every decision and action at The Bay.

#### **Guiding Principles**

- One Park for All: Is open and accessible, free and welcoming to the full and rich diversity of the community... now, and for generations to come.
- Transformation: Transforms a parking lot into a signature public park.
- Blue & Green Oasis: Preserves, restores and transforms 53 acres of precious city-owned land along Sarasota Bay into a blue & green oasis.
- A Gathering Place: An enlivened destination for family, friends and fun.
- Sustainable in Every Way: Is financially feasible, operationally doable, and environmentally sustainable.
- A Community of Partnerships: Enables aspirations to be realized at The Bay every day.

### The Bay Park Master Plan

- A <u>Master Plan</u> is a conceptual design that shows a plan of park guest possible uses.
- The original Master Plan for the 53-acre site was unanimously approved the Sarasota City Commission in Sept '18.
- In November '23, an updated Master Plan reflecting additional learning and community feedback was approved.
- The completed park in total will cost an estimated \$175-200 million and will take approximately 8-10 years to complete over four or more phases.
- Phase 1 of the park -- 10+ acres of green space and gathering places -- opened in October 2022. (Cost: \$30 million -- 90% Private, 10% City/ Gov't Grants)
- Phase 2 -- the next 14-acre \$65 million development -- is fully funded and underway, with expected completion in 2026. (Funding: 74% TIF City-backed bond, 26% Gov't Grants/ Private)

#### **Quick Facts**

- Every year, current park treats 70+ million gallons of polluted stormwater before entering Sarasota Bay.
  - Once complete, the entire 53-acre
    Bay park site will treat 300 million
    gallons of stormwater annually.
- 2-3 ft of polluted sediment removed from Bayou floor improved tidal flow & habitat.
- 3,000+ cubic yards of polluted sediment was removed from the Canal.
- <u>Phase 2</u> extends restoration of 1 mile of contiguous natural resilient shoreline.
- The current 10-acre park features:
  - Walkways & Bayfront Promenades
  - o Golf-course quality Lawns
  - Dozens of rescued trees, 1,000's of Florida-friendly plants
  - Botanical Gardens
  - Small natural beach
  - Larger-than-life Ibis Playground
  - Architectural Shade Structure



The Bay Park Conservancy (BPC) is a 501c3 non-profit responsible for designing and implementing the Master Plan approved by the Sarasota City Commission. The BPC entered into a long-term 15-year Public-Private Partnership with the City to help fund, develop, operate, maintain and program The Bay park for the benefit of the community... now, and for generations to come.

# **Environmental Sustainability at The Bay**

GOAL: Transform what was mostly parking lot into a signature sustainable public park.



- The Bay converts 53 acres of precious city-owned bayfront land from what was ~20% green space into a blue-and-green oasis in downtown Sarasota.
- The current 10-acre park includes:
  - A 1/2-mile, 10-foot wide Mangrove Bayou walkway around coastal wetlands.
  - 10 acres of golf-course quality lawns.
  - Dozens of rescued trees, thousands of Florida-friendly plants.
  - o A small natural beach.
  - Botanical gardens.

GOAL: Protect Sarasota Bay from the City... and the City from Sarasota Bay.

### **Protect Sarasota Bay from the City**



- The Bay is the last line of defense for 300 million gallons of annual polluted urban stormwater runoff before it flows into Sarasota Bay.
- The current 10-acre park:
  - Improves water quality of 70+ million gallons of polluted stormwater that flows through the park's built-in "treatment train" -- removing silt, pollutants and other debris along the way.
  - Included removal of 2-3' of polluted silt from the Mangrove Bayou floor which helped restore better tidal flow, facilitated sea grass growth, and improved the habitat for many native plant and animal species.

### Protect the City from Sarasota Bay

• The Bay is converting 1-mile of hardened shorelines into resilient shorelines enabling nature to handle and endure the flooding and storm surges that are inherent parts of tropical storms and hurricanes.
